1. I am the fourth son of Henry Clay. I supported the Confederacy. During the Civil War, I left my home, Ashland, and moved to Canada. Who am I?



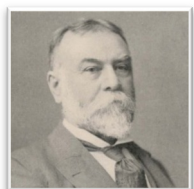

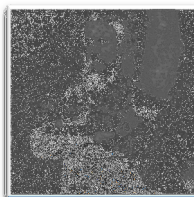
